We are God's people who believe in the power of the resurrection, new life. and transformation. As resurrection people our minds and hopeful hearts are open to new possibilities. My prayer is that you will join this process as we discern together where God is leading our church. May God's blessings be upon us as enter uncharted territory.

UPCOMING WORSHIP – LENT & EASTER

March 26 – 10 a.m. – Can These Bones Live?

In Ezekiel's vision, God asks "Can these bones live?" Do we believe new life can come after death? Can we find hope when things are bleak? Can we really trust in God's resurrection? While we look to God to carry us through the valley, God looks to us to embody hope for others. As we prepare to enter Holy Week, we remember how Jesus began his final journey toward resurrection. As we walk through the valley of dry bones that leads us to Calvary Hill, let us seek out the hope that will stir in us and sustain us. **Scripture:** John 11:1-45 | Ezekiel 37:1-14

April 2 – 10 a.m. – Palm/Passion Sunday: Where Are You Headed?

Imagine you are in Jerusalem when Jesus enters on a donkey. Within the chaos and commotion of that scene, where are you and which way will you go? Will you follow Jesus all the way to the cross? Jesus' willing surrender to his arrest should always catch us off-guard. As dismayed as the disciples, we ask, "Jesus, are you really headed this way, straight to your death?" Many of our weekly questions throughout the season so far have helped us prepare spiritually for Holy Week. Now we examine if our beliefs have changed our behaviors. Has your path changed? In the midst of opposing forces, which way will you go? **Scripture:** Matthew 21:1-11

April 6 – 5:30 p.m. Soup Supper and 6:30 p.m. Maundy Thursday Worship in the Covenant Room

In his final night with his friends and followers, Jesus shows the fullness of his love by removing his robe, kneeling, and washing the disciples' feet. As he makes his way around the room, Jesus comes to Simon Peter who protests, "Lord, are you going to wash my feet?" Like Peter, we may also question if God loves us and will care for us, even at the brink of death. In these final hours of accompanying Jesus to his grave, can we seek a posture of trust? Can we allow ourselves to be embraced and loved—by our neighbor and by God?

April 7 – 12 p.m. – Good Friday Service

This ecumenical, contemplative service will be held at Waquoit Congregational Church.

April 9 – 6 a.m. – Easter Sunrise Service at Megansett Beach

April 9 – 10 a.m. – Easter: Who Are You Looking For?

Jesus, mysteriously appearing to Mary as the gardener, asks her: "Why are you weeping? Who are you looking for?" In the haze of grief, Mary can only see what is right before her—or in this case, what is not before her. It is only when Jesus calls her by name that the veil is lifted, and she beholds the resurrected Christ. On this Easter morning, who—or what—are you looking for? Why have you come to the tomb? What kind of Jesus are you looking for? What veils need to be lifted so we can recognize God's resurrection wherever it occurs? **Scripture:** John 20:1-18

April 16 – 10 a.m. – Holy Humor Sunday

Join us for some holy hilarity as we start the Easter season with celebration, joy, and laughter. Come in your wackiest outfit, come ready to sing, come ready to laugh. For centuries, the week following Easter Sunday was observed by the faithful as "days of joy and laughter" with parties and picnics to celebrate Jesus' resurrection.

CWS Hygiene Kits – Still Collecting



CWS collection boxes will be located through-out the church. On Sunday, April 16 the final collection box will be placed out in front of the church. See the list below for the items needed.

- One hand towel measuring approximately 15" x 28" to 16" x 32" (no fingertip, bath, dish towel or micro-fiber)
- One washcloth
- One wide-tooth comb removed from the package
 - Must be sturdy with at least 6 inches of teeth
 - No pocket combs or picks
 - Rattail and combs without handles are acceptable
- One fingernail or toenail clipper removed from the package (either one is acceptable)
- One bath-size bar of soap in the original package
- · Ten standard size Band-Aids
- Wide-tooth Comb

All items need to fit inside a one-gallon Ziploc type bag. Remove the excess air from the bag and seal before boxing.

Do NOT add any toothpaste. A tube of extended expiration date toothpaste will be added to each hygiene kit just prior to its final journey.
