Dear Friends,

In the last few days the hint of spring in the air has been balm to our winter weary spirits. There is something about buds on the trees and the early morning songs of the birds that are so encouraging! There is a sense of new life and new beginnings everywhere, not only in the natural world around us, but in our own lives as well. But growth requires attention and care. Easter day has come and gone but the season of Easter tide continues because the church marks the 50 days after Easter until Pentecost, which this year is Sunday May 20.

Joan Chittister, the Benedictine nun notes that in this slip-slide from winter into spring, from dark to light is an exercise in saying “yes” to life. Yes to today; yes to tomorrow; yes to life again. She notes that we all come out of the tomb of winter new and bright with promise. It is “yes” to life time now, however old, however jaded we may be. It is the rediscovery of possibility again.

For us now in this Easter tide season, we can take the time to look back and recall the empty tomb. Remember those times in life where all seemed lost and yet we were not overcome and beaten down because amazing faith entered in to fill the dark spots? The truth is that all of us have had times where we have each risen from

the dead in our own ways. Yes, the Easter season is about more than Jesus’ Resurrection. It is also an invitation for our own rising. Remember that everyone around Jesus was changed; Mary Magdalene rose again, this time a disciple. The apostles rose again, this time with courage and purpose. Many people who had been marginalized by society found new acceptance and purpose in following Jesus and modeling their lives after his teachings and rose again.

As we prepare to celebrate Pentecost on May 20, we recognize and remember the gift of the Holy Spirit coming to enliven and empower the early followers of Jesus. As we consider the Pentecost story, perhaps we can write a new chapter, one that is written with our own lives, with ways we can say yes today and tomorrow to where God is leading us!

Encore Presentation of “Our Warming Planet: What Should We Do?”

May 6, 2018 NFCC after church in the Covenant Room

On Sunday May 6th after the 10AM service, Meg Tivey will give an encore presentation of the panel forum “Our Warming Planet: What Should We Do?” that was held on Sunday afternoon, March 18th, at the First Congregational Church of Falmouth, in collaboration with the North Falmouth Congregational Church and the Waquoit Congregational Church. The March 18 panel forum included Tom Stone, John Farrington, and Meg Tivey presenting scientific information about climate change, followed by Reverend Jim Antal discussing the broad ethical issues raised by the evidence for climate change.

On May 6th Meg will show the slides that were used during the March 18 forum, answer questions, and lead a discussion about this important issue. Please

come and join this discussion. It will provide people here at NFCC with information and background on climate change. Many of us may then want to participate in the remaining two small-group discussion sessions being held at the First Congregational Church on Monday evenings in May. The next session—on theological concerns—will take place on Monday, May 7, from 7:00 to 8:30pm, and the final session—on the action agenda--will then take place on Monday, May 21 at the same time, both at the First Congregational Church of Falmouth, 68 Main Street.
