HYMN OF INVITATION

RESPONSIVE INVITATION TO THE TABLE

L: This God’s table—not set for the perfect, but for the hungry and the weary.

All: We come not because we are worthy, but because we are welcome.

L: Here, bread is broken for the brokenhearted and the cup is poured out for all who thirst for mercy.

All: Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they shall be filled.

L: Come, you who mourn. Come, you who seek peace. Come, you who long for justice and kindness.

All: We come to receive grace, to drop what weighs us down, and to be nourished by love.

PRAISE AND THANKS

L: Let us give thanks to God.

All: We give you thanks, O God, for your love that meets us where we are, for mercy that holds us fast, and for blessing spoken over weary lives.

L: We thank you for Jesus, who walked among the poor in spirit, who stood with the grieving, who fed the hungry and welcomed the outcast.

All: In his life, death, and resurrection, we see your justice made flesh and your kindness poured out without measure.

L: With hearts opened by grace, we praise your holy name, O God.

All: Glory and honor are yours, now and forever. Amen.

PRAYER TO THE HOLY SPIRIT

L: Come, Holy Spirit—move among us now. Bless this bread and this cup, so that they may be for us the body and blood of Christ. Breathe into us courage where there is fear, mercy where there is anger, and hope where there is despair. Unite us with Christ and with one another, that we may leave this table strengthened to do justice, love kindness, and walk humbly in your world.

All: Come, Holy Spirit. Make us one in love. Amen.

SHARING BREAD AND CUP

UNISON PRAYER OF THANKSGIVING

Gracious God, we give you thanks for this holy meal for bread that strengthens us, and a cup that renews our hope. You have fed us with grace when we were hungry for justice and met us with mercy when our hearts were weary. Send us now into the world as people who have been blessed, not forgotten—to bear your light and to follow Jesus with love and peace. In Christ’s name we pray. Amen.
