"I give you thanks, O Lord, with my whole heart; before the gods I sing your praise; I bow down toward your holy temple and give thanks to your name for your steadfast love and your faithfulness; for you have exalted your name and your word above everything." Psalm 138:1-2

Dear Friends.

When I write, I like to look for synonyms so that I am not repeating the same word over and over. For instance, when I look up a synonym for gratefulness, the word thankfulness pops up. I interchange these two words all the time. But I stand corrected by Brother David Steindl-Rast, the founder for A Network for Grateful Living.

Brother David Steindl-Rast makes a distinction between the two words. The words "gratitude" and "thanksgiving" are different terms for our experiences, he says. We all experience gratitude welling up in our hearts. We feel joy expanding inside us, but we can't articulate it right away. And when that joy bursts to overflowing, we want to thank someone. This is thanksgiving. Gratitude and thanksgiving are the two phases of gratefulness. But when our heart is full of gratitude and doesn't overflow, there is no thankfulness. We don't experience the fullness of joy gratitude offers.

The Psalms are such rich examples of how gratitude bubbles up and spills over into thankfulness despite despair, fear, fury, shame, disappointment, and a sense of injustice and unfairness. The psalmist is not glad for life's hard stuff, but he still experiences the feeling of overflowing gratitude for God's faithfulness, and he is insistent on expressing thankfulness to God.

Feeling gratitude and giving thanks are part of Christian life. It lies at the heart of communion—also known as the Eucharist which literally means "to give thanks." Thankfulness is a central act in both the Psalms and Epistles. It infuses our daily prayers. Worship and faith formation teach us to embody gratitude and offer thankfulness as we navigate life.

Thanksgiving is a time to contemplate all the ways God blesses our lives. May our hearts overflow with gratitude as we bow down in thankfulness for God's abundant love and faithfulness in our lives and in this church. In all things, give thanks.

Chrismons



Again this year, the Altar Committee is decorating the sanctuary for Advent and the Christmas season. The white and gold ornaments placed on the tree and the wreaths are called Chrismons. They were handmade by the

ladies of our church back in the 1980s. The original Chrismons were developed in 1957 at a Lutheran church in Virginia as a decoration appropriate for the church Christmas tree as opposed to the colored lights and secular symbols being used at that time. The Chrismons are Christian symbols made in white with gold decorations. "Chrismons cannot be bought or sold; they can only be made, given in love, and in celebration of Christ's birth." The NFCC is truly fortunate to have these beautiful symbols of the true Christmas decorating our sanctuary.
