Dear Friends,

Joy is in the hum of the universe. It is the luminous web flung across the night sky. It is the effervescence of gratitude. It lightens burdens with its exclamations. ServSafe Food Manager Food Certification

All commercial kitchens are required by the Board of Health to have someone onsite who is a certified ServSafe Food Manager. Our church is currently looking for a volunteer to become certified. A training course is being offered in Barnstable for two, 4-hour sessions 9 a.m. – 1 p.m. on Mondays, January 23 and 30. The next course is in March. The church will cover all costs. See poster below.

The important part of this work is to ensure those preparing and serving food know the rules: how to sanitize the counters, washing and drying pots and dishes, use of gloves for one thing, cooking temperatures to kill bacteria, and not to serve if you have a cold or other illness.
