When Aaron and the Israelites saw that Moses' face was shining, they were afraid to get too close to him. When Moses finished sharing the words of God with them, he covered his face with a veil.

—Exodus 34:30, 33

Dear Friends.

In Moses' day, God lived on Mt Sinai in a thunderous, fiery cloud that struck terror in the stoutest of hearts. On many occasions, God invited Moses into that terrifying cloud to talk. One day, after talking to God about the Ten Commandments, Moses made his way down the mountain to share them with the Israelites. What he didn't realize was how brightly his face shone from being in God's presence. The people looked at him and were terrified. So, Moses had to wear a veil until the shine wore off.

I have yet to encounter God's presence in a fiery pillar or thunderous cloud with lightening flashing about. Like the Israelites, I'm too busy being scared of thunderstorms, tornadoes, and hurricanes. I would add erupting volcanos to the list if I ever witnessed one. But there are some who relish going out into thunderstorms or chasing down tornados. It is probably for the thrill of it all. But I wonder, do they encounter God's powerful and fearful presence in them? Do their faces shine?

Early this morning, as I dragged my trash barrels to the curb, I delighted in crispness of the air and the singing of the song sparrow and the Carolina wren. I immediately felt gratitude for God revealing God's living presence through them. I wondered, did my face shine a little brighter afterwards?

Personally, I like my encounters with God to be calm and gentle—none of this fiery pillar stuff for me. Yet, we can meet God in those dark and scary things life throws at us. Think of all the hardships you have encountered and gotten through them with God's grace. Think about the times you walked through a dark period in your life and came out the other side liberated and transformed.

Life *can* be scary and terrifying at times. Yet, in the whirlwind of it all, God is there leading us to the promised land we so long for—to that place of peace and calm where God's abundance flows.

However you encounter God today, in life's fiery pillars or in a sweet bird song—may your face shine a little brighter for having seen God.


