Dear Friends,

We see so much written about gratitude these days that it can feel like overload. But that's a good thing. It means more and more of us are realizing the power of gratitude. We've been learning how it is good for our mood and health. It helps us relish good experiences and build strong relationships. Being grateful helps us connect to something larger than ourselves. When we are grateful, we start to recognize the source of goodness lies partially outside ourselves—we start to see the many ways God's handiwork is woven through our lives.

In a letter to the Thessalonians, Paul tells his flock to give thanks in all things. It is one thing to give thanks when life is going well, but giving thanks when life takes a turn for the worse doesn't come naturally. When we are in the depths of suffering, mustering an attitude of gratitude is harder. Can suffering and gratitude can coexist?

Victor Frankl in his book Man's Search for Meaning so eloquently describes how suffering enabled him and other prisoners to discover what was truly important in life—"We were grateful for the smallest of mercies." Suffering and gratitude is a pattern repeated over and over in the Psalms—one is never without the other. In one breath, the psalmist writes about their woes. In the next, the psalmist expresses jubilant gratitude for God's faithfulness.

According to Fr. Anthony de Mello, "we sanctify whatever we are grateful for." In other words, we make something holy and sacred just by being grateful, whether it is a child's smile, a gorgeous sunset at Old Silver beach, or the person who made you laugh. When we are grateful, we are attentive to the sacred around us.

Whether your days are bright or dark, may joy of gratitude make the ordinary things of life holy.


