Dear Friends,

My cat is very good at resting. He knows how to stretch out in a patch of sun and let its warmth lull him to sleep. He grooms himself without a care in the world. As I prepare for my sabbatical this July, I find myself reflecting on the gift and the practice of holy rest. Sabbath is a time when we step back from wrestling with the world, from crossing off to-do lists, and from filling every empty moment with busyness. It is a time to tend to the seed of eternity planted deep within the soul. My hope for this sabbatical is to care for my soul as one tends a garden — gently weeding, watering, and turning it toward the light. Like my cat, I hope to receive the nourishment that true rest offers.

Rest, of course, comes in many forms. It is far more than simply getting a good
